

Senior Update- Week of November 21st



Some Information on Applications:

- Some colleges/universities will let the student know when application information has been received (by e-mail, letter, etc.)
- **Some colleges/universities DO NOT give the student any information on whether to not application information has been received**
- When the schools give students instructions on setting up a “website” portal on the individual colleges website, students should do that right away – This will give students information on the status of their applications

- **Please note that what is up on the student website portal is not always accurate – colleges have individuals who update application materials as they come into the school – sometimes it takes over two weeks for what is in the admissions office to “catch up” with what is indicated on the student website portal – although it is very important to let Miss Hoyt know if something seems missing, students **SHOULD NOT PANIC** about this – Monday, for example, Miss Hoyt called Keene State about an allegedly missing transcript (which we saw as downloaded on the common application) – the counselor told Miss Hoyt that the school is three weeks behind in uploading material that was received on the common application**



- **Students should let Miss Hoyt know IMMEDIATELY when they receive acceptances from colleges – We all want to share in this great news – and Miss Hoyt also needs to check on due dates for things, etc. Sometimes in the excitement of receiving an acceptance, students do not take notice of important information such as when deposits are due, etc.**

- **Students should let Miss Hoyt know IMMEDIATELY if they receive any denials from colleges – we need to quickly do an appeals letter – this involves a specific process – and the sooner we get this information in, the more serious the colleges feel the student is about getting in – often times, when Miss Hoyt speaks to colleges, the counselors will provide information on how to appeal – and often, the colleges eventually accept the student.**
