Scholarship – The foundation is once again offering its annual art scholarship. The awards are for \$5,000.00. 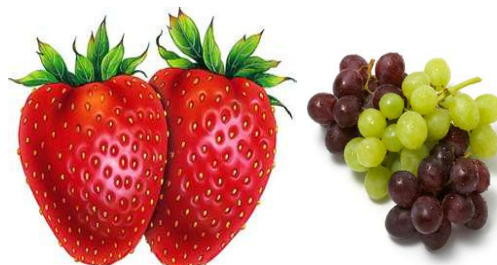


- **The Sharps Compliance, Inc.**
