The Prout School Prescription Medication Policy

If it is necessary that a medication be given during school hours, the following regulations must be followed.

- > The Prout Prescription Medication form must be filled out and signed by the prescribing physician.
- > Parent must complete and sign authorization form.
- > Parent or guardian is required to bring medication to school.
- > All medication must be in the current pharmacy labeled container, and include the following information:
 - ✓ Student's name
 - ✓ Directions for administration
 - ✓ Physician's name
- Authorization for medication is effective for the length of time prescribed, and no longer than the current school year.
- > The school nurse will dispense medication.
- No student should have in his/her possession any medication while on school property. Inhalers and EpiPens are an exception to this rule.
 - Inhalers may be self-administered if prior authorization by his/her physician has been provided to the school.
 - EpiPens may be self administered or given by any school personnel trained to administer EpiPens. The school requires advanced notification (authorization from a physician) for all children who may need access to an EpiPen.

If the student will be on a field trip, or other school supported event—a medication plan will be developed and agreed to by the parent, physician and school administration.
